This course gives practicing professionals the information and support necessary to become a clinical counseling supervisor, and to meet the 30-hour training requirement for supervisors of the Oregon Board of Licensed and Professional Counselors and Therapists (OBLPCT). The course is designed for current and future supervisors of graduate interns, clinical staff and licensure candidates. Topics covered include: theories, goals, and methods of supervision; the roles of the supervisor; gender and cultural issues in supervision; creating a supervisory contract, and legal, ethical and professional issues. Participants will have the opportunity to discuss actual supervisory challenges as well as role-play common scenarios in class.
