



Clinical Director, Marriage and Family Therapy MS Program Assistant or Associate Professor

Oregon Tech invites applications for one full-time, tenure-track appointment at an assistant or associate professor-level at our Klamath Falls campus. The person appointed to this position will be the Clinical Director for the new MS program in Marriage and Family Therapy. This is a 12-month position, with the opportunity to begin the appointment as early as June. Oregon Tech seeks an enthusiastic faculty member who can bring knowledge, experience and vision to this new program. Oregon Tech offers competitive salaries with excellent benefits including comprehensive healthcare, a generous retirement and vacation package, and reduced tuition benefit.

Oregon Tech is the only accredited public polytechnic university in the Pacific Northwest. We offer innovative and rigorous applied degree programs. Candidates for this position must prize excellence in teaching and mentoring. In addition to teaching, the primary responsibility will be to establish a community-based training clinic, developed in close collaboration with dedicated community partners, focused on Marriage and Family Therapy in rural mental health care and child and family services.

The MS MFT program has a strong curriculum informed by the needs of underserved rural populations in southern Oregon and northern California. These populations include Klamath Tribes families, migratory farm worker families, and families struggling with multigenerational poverty. The new MFT program is housed in Oregon Tech's Humanities and Social Sciences department; a collegial environment that encourages interdisciplinary collaboration, particularly between healthcare and the social sciences. Successful candidates will be expected to provide service to the university and community, contribute to achieving departmental goals, and maintain professional development activities.

Minimum Qualifications

- Master's degree in Marriage and Family Therapy or closely related field with three (3) years' experience in the field.
- Three (3) years' clinical and clinical supervisory experience, including work in community service agencies with underserved and rural populations
- Eligibility for MFT or LPC clinical licensure in Oregon and eligibility for inclusion in Oregon's Approved Supervisor registry.
- Visionary, collaborative leadership style
- Demonstrated excellence in teaching and clinical mentoring at the MS level
- Interest in developing a medical family therapy program

Preferred Qualifications

- Doctorate in Marriage and Family Therapy or closely related field
- Experience in developing a medical family therapy program
- Experience with a "*Self of the Therapist*" model
- Experience with hybrid course design and delivery
- LPC with significant experience in marriage and family counseling
- Grant writing experience
